

The LYON AIR MUSEUM EXPERIENCE


Throughout my 30-year career at LAX airport administration, I was able to establish working relationships with airport executives at a number of Southern California airports. Through one of my connections at John Wayne Airport, I was fortunate enough to liaison with the staff of the Lyon Air Museum to coordinate the 'Corvettes on the Flight Line' event on April 22.

PCC members met at 7 am for a pre-event briefing on the West side of the airport, before proceeding to an airport entrance that led our Corvettes under escort onto the tarmac to park on the Lyon Air Museum flight line. Blessed with a beautiful sunny morning and clear skies, approximately 28 of our members were joined by Corvettes from around Orange County. In total, there were approximately 90 Corvettes that participated in this exciting Corvette show, including one gorgeous Cirrus private aircraft that Bob Rose brought from a hangar across the runways. Commercial and private aircraft using the runways just a few feet away from us provided a very interesting background! All cars were directed to parking positions by very organized museum staff and everyone was parked by 9:30 am.

All participants were able to tour the museum and observe priceless aircraft and interesting WW II vehicles, including a 1940s Mercedes Benz limousine used by Adolf Hitler.

Marker Wise and Mike O'Connor were able to be escorted to the roof of the building to capture some amazing photos of the colorful Corvettes assembled below. Overall, the event seemed to be a success and before we knew it our time was up and we were all escorted off the airfield. Hopefully we will be able to add this event to our calendar again in the future!

I was thrilled to set up the event as John Wayne Airport shares a special part of my life. In the late 1970s and early 1980s, I worked at JWA for Air California airlines, a small regional intrastate airline that flew to all major California cities. The airline was owned by Westgate-California Corporation, an organization that was based in San Diego and owned financial institutions, a major portion of the city's tuna fleetand at one time the San Diego Padres Continued on page 17

baseball team. Air California was based in Newport Beach and its headquarters were located at the intersection of Birch and Quail streets, just one block from Campus Jax.

The commercial aviation

industry and Air California both suffered a financial downturn during the recession of 1981 and was losing money. Lyon Air Museum founder William Lyon, a retired Air Force general that became a major real estate developer in Orange County, bought the struggling Air California and became our airline's chief executive. Within a few months, Mr. Lyon purchased new aircraft, including the all-new McDonnel Douglas MD-80 and Boeing 737-300s. He also upgraded the airline's image with a new paint scheme and shortened the airline's name to AirCal.



As the airline industry recovered, so did AirCal, and by 1985 it returned to profitability. By 1986, American Airlines was seeking

to increase its West Coast presence and made an offer to purchase AirCal from Mr. Lyon. So, in 1987 the purchase was complete and AirCal became a part of American Airlines. Mr. Lyon gained a substantial profit from the sale and I went from working for a small regional airline of 3,500 employees to an established major airline with a workforce of 100,000 employees and a global route network. In 1990, I left American Airlines to take a position with LAX administration.

Now that I am retired, I volunteer at JWA as an information ambassador where I provide travelers with information and, occasionally, stare out the terminal windows to look at the aircraft on the tarmac and remember those wonderful days of my youth working for AirCal.
